Principal's Message

It is hard to believe that we are almost a quarter of the way through the first term of the school year at Community High School. The annual change of season is certainly in the cooler air!

I would like to spend a minute talking about MI-TIME, an exciting addition to the school day for our students. Two fifteen (15) minute periods of our school day are dedicated to a concept we call MI-TIME, which is designed to provide a Response to Intervention (RtI) model that is both student-centered and student-driven. During this time, students are encouraged to be responsible for catching up on work, soliciting help from a teacher, or wisely use time to take care of office or other issues that would typically take time away from instruction in our old system. Staff members are available during both MI-TIME slots during the day and have continued to encourage students to use MI-TIME as a tool of efficiency and individual effectiveness. We are excited to see this concept in action and find it to be a valuable resource in helping students succeed!

I would encourage you to get involved. We welcome any suggestions that will help us to continue to deliver a quality education to our students. We are also in need of a parent representative for the district Parent Advisory Council. Please feel free to contact us if you have any concerns or questions.



Attendance Policy

Arriving to class on time, prepared and attending on a regular basis is essential for academic success. Seven absences from any class may result in loss of credit in that class for the term. Students are marked tardy within the first 10 minutes of class; after 10 minutes, counts as an absence. Tardy three times in one class equal one absence.

Students arriving within the first 10 minutes of the school day should report directly to their first hour class and will be marked tardy. Students arriving more than 10 minutes late must report to the office, sign in and get a pass.

Leaving the building or grounds (including at lunch) without following proper sign-out procedures in the office will be considered an absence for the remainder of the day and will result in student discipline. Please make every attempt to schedule appointments around the school hours and calendar.
